

The city of Guelph has a population of 121,000 and is one hour from Toronto, Canada's largest city and airline hub, and less than 2 hours from the Niagara Falls. US border.

How to Apply

Secondary School Applicants

To be considered for admission, scholarships, and on-campus accommodation, please follow the steps listed below. Read on for details on the Application Method that is correct for you.

Select the Program of Study and Institution from the list on pages 9 through 11 and check the program specific admission information and required courses.

Check Country Specific and English Proficiency Requirements on pages 14 and 15.

Check to see if your program is offered at the University of Guelph, University of Guelph-Humber or if it is an Associate Diploma or Degree offered at one of the Regional Campuses (Alfred, Kemptville, or Ridgetown), see pages 24 and 25 to ensure the correct application method is used.

Fill in and Submit the appropriate Application Form along with your fee, using the following listed methods for your program and institution of choice.

Applying to the University of Guelph (main campus) International Applicants (2 choices) You may: Apply to Guelph using the correct format depending on your campus location and status.

a) Apply directly to University of Guelph main campus International Admission Services using the downloadable University of Guelph International Application form (GIA) or the on-line form available at admission.uoguelph.ca.

b) Or apply on-line through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) at www.ouac.on.ca.

Upon receipt of your application Admission Services will provide you with a **WebAdvisor** account. This online account allows you to monitor the status of your application and check what documents are outstanding.

Submit the appropriate high school/secondary school diploma and other required documentation to the institution where your program is located. For **University of Guelph** (main

campus) programs send transcripts to International Admission Services at the University of Guelph. For programs offered at **University of Guelph-Humber** send to Admissions Services at the University of Guelph-Humber. See back cover for specific addresses.

Application Deadline Dates: Fall Semester (September) – March 1.

Applications received after March 1 will be considered only if space is available in the selected program. It is the applicant's responsibility to submit all documents before the deadline dates.

Some programs have supplemental forms and distinct deadlines. Please see admission.uoquelph.ca for details.

Document Deadlines Dates: Fall Semester (September) – March 1.

Submit English Proficiency test scores following the instructions in Step 5, if required. Detailed information is available on specific English requirements on page 14.

You are encouraged to submit the on-line **Student Profile Form admission.uoguelph.ca/spf** by March 1. Students applying to the University of Guelph-Humber can find the Student Profile Form online at **quelphhumber.ca**.

Obtain a Study Permit (Student Visa)

The University does not issue Study

Permits. To study in Canada you must apply for a Study Permit at the nearest Canadian Embassy, High Commission or Consulate. Students are encouraged to contact the Canadian Immigration office regarding visa procedures well before they receive an offer of admission. Refer to the Canadian Immigration website: www.cic.gc.ca for more information. All international students attending the University of Guelph or the University of Guelph-Humber must have a valid Study Permit.

If you are an international applicant who has previously attended College or University, please consult our International Transfer Student Admission Requirements on our websites. Applications for September admission will be considered as they are received, until the application deadline of May 1. Your document submission deadline for most degree programs is June 1, however please contact Admission Services as program specific deadlines vary. Transfer students interested in January admission should also consult Admission Services for program availability.

International Admission Requirements

If you are applying to the University of Guelph from another country, the official secondary school graduation certificate used to admit you to an internationally recognized university in your home country is normally acceptable for consideration for admission. Please note that the possession of the minimum entry requirements does not guarantee admission or preclude your admission counsellor from requesting further documentation or verification procedures.

Advanced Placement (AP)

Applicants who have completed Advanced Placement Examinations with a minimum grade of 4 may receive university credit to a maximum of 2.0 credits, subject to the discretion of the Degree Program Admission Committee. Please arrange for an official school report to be sent directly to Admissions Services at the campus where your program is located. Transfer credit will be assigned once official final transcripts have been received.

American Patterned Education: High School Diploma (USA)

Applicants must have a minimum unweighted grade point average of 3.0 from a regionally accredited high school and a combined Math and Critical Reading SAT score of 1100 (excluding the Writing Test score) or ACT score of 24. Applicants should include among their senior level courses, specific subjects that are required for admission to

their degree program of choice. Particular attention is paid to performance in program prerequisites. Students should ensure that senior year final grades from first semester and second semester interim grades are submitted before the March 1st document deadline date. British Patterned Education: General Certificate of Education Requirements (GCE)

- Minimum of two Advanced Level passes and three GCSE or IGCSE (Ordinary Level) passes.
- Two Advanced Supplementary (AS) Level courses may be substituted for one Advanced Level course.

Applicants are expected to present a minimum 'B' grade on GCSE/IGCSE, AS and predicted Advanced level examinations. While consideration will be given to subject prerequisites at the GCSE/IGCSE level, students are strongly encouraged to present requirements at the AS or Advanced level. Please note that general paper is not considered an acceptable subject. Transfer credits will be considered for Advanced Level subjects with a final grade of C or better up to a maximum of 3.0 credits (1.0

credit per course). Note: In one academic year students generally complete 5.0 credits.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

Students applying with an IB diploma should present a minimum score of 28, some programs will require a higher score for admission consideration. Reported bonus points will be taken into consideration.

Applicants must complete the IB diploma with six subjects: 3 higher level and 3 standard level. Students should also include specific subject requirements for the program to which they are applying among their standard and higher level courses. Please note that Math Studies is not an acceptable prerequisite for most programs that require mathematics. Applicants currently completing the IB diploma will be considered for admission based upon predicted IB scores. Transfer credit may be given for higher level courses with grades of 5 or better to a maximum of 2.0 credits. Students should ensure that their predicted scores are submitted using the 7 point scale. Transfer credit will be assigned once official final transcripts have been received in Admission Services.

French Baccalaureat

Students applying with a French Baccalaureat should present a minimum overall score of 12 out of 20. Specific subject prerequisites should be completed at the highest co-efficient level.






